Programme Director, Psalm 118 verse 24 says "This is the day that the Lord has made. We will rejoice and be glad in it." I am indeed delighted to be standing before you this morning to give an account of the hard work that our frontliners, our

This is the hard work by our districts, circuits, schools and learners themselves. What should resonate with each one of us as we announce these results is that there is no substitute for hard work and that a reward is always within reach where hard work is involved.

The **HoD** in her technical remarks has detailed the profile of the 2023 cohort and a deduction can be made that this cohort went through a lot in their academic journey. That background gives us reasons to put more springs in our steps as we are gathered here today to celebrate the cohort whose academic journey started in 2012 during the 5th year of the National Senior Certificate (NSC). Clearly it was no walk in the park.

Honourable Premier, we will forever be indebted to you as the department for the sterling support that you have given to ensure that we strive for excellence across the education system. The reality is that we cannot expect best results at the highest level while there is continuous neglect of phases that should give us the very best results at Grade 12. There must be deliberate investment and concerted effort to pay attention to all grades from Foundation Phase to the FET Phase. Your continued unwavering support and passion for education has served as a

reminder that there should be no room for complacency and comfort zones at a workplace, especially one that is charged with the massive responsibility of nurturing a young mind into a responsible citizen.

We recall fondly the hope you instilled in some of these candidates during last year's back to school campaign in Sekhukhune. You gave them confidence that they can shine like diamonds in the sky. The pep talk has produced magic, we are today bragging of stars that have passed with flying colours and still destined for greater heights.

I declared 2023 a year of accelerated school infrastructure to restore the dignity of a black child. We can report honourable members that a learner attending in a decent school and improved sanitation facility is a happy learner. We have noted in our analysis that we have new schools, especially from the rural areas that have done well this year. Our effort in pushing for better learning facilities was not in vain. The work of creating a teaching and learning environment that is conducive is one which must continue without us apologising. In that way, we shall be able to demand top performance across the system knowing that we have done our part as a Department.

Programme Director, we are a province on a rise. The upward trajectory is a testimony that we have dedicated men and women

who are passionate about their work. Our children spend six days per week at school and endure long hours in camps during school holidays. The extra effort by teachers, the support from parents, SGB members, sponsors and various formations is highly commendable. I want to take this opportunity to thank you for your selfless contribution to the future of our children.

It is against this background that it will be amiss of us not to pay tribute to all those partners who saw it necessary and proper to work with us and devote their time in ensuring that we carry out the business of providing quality and innovative education for learners across all grades. Learner performance should be a concern for all of us and indeed our deep gratitude goes to all our partners in the twelve year journey.

Honourable premier and esteemed guests, we are on a journey to change the narrative about our beautiful province as we declare **2024 a year of academic excellence**. We are turning the tide and steering the ship to the right direction. Tracking back from 2021, we recorded 67 percent pass rate and a boost of **5 percent** in 2022 that took us to **72,1 percent**. It is my singular honour to announce to the Province that the 2023 cohort has recorded a huge improvement of **7,3 percent** from the previous

class of 2022. I am presenting to you an improved pass rate of **79.5 percent** and thanks to the Class of 2023. We are not only celebrating the increase in percentage but I am glad to announce that we have moved from our last spot, we have jumped two steps from position 9 to 7. They deserve a round of APPLAUSE.

This performance represents a whopping increase in the quality by 7,9% from 66,7% in 2021 to 72.1% in 2022. The class of 2023 has really made the province proud. The province has indeed outperformed itself qualitatively and quantitively.

By all means, we have to keep moving. We have to keep improving. We have to keep performing. We have to keep excelling. We accordingly issue a stern warning to anyone who would want to stop or derail the fast-moving train, **tshaba re Phude.** We are not looking back, we are motivated by the cohort of 2023 and we have no doubt that the class of 2024 will even do much better.

Our on-going efforts and commitment to improving the matric pass and importantly the long term strategy to improve the quality of education is something that cannot be relegated to the background by any means.

Programme Director, We shall continue to call for active participation, involving broader community to ensure that young people are encouraged at all levels to make education and excellent performance fashionable. This should be a commitment that occupies all of us to ensure that quality education is delivered in schools. It is all of us that must be involved in the creation of an environment that is conducive to teaching and learning and the results thereof will be desirable.

I want to thank in particular the Education Desk coordinators in various traditional committees. The increasing number of education foundations that in the main support learners from disadvantaged background. My colleagues from the legislature who have adopted schools and bringing the necessary positive change. I know Coghsta MEC Basikopo Makumu is leading from the front in schools around Giyani in Mopani. Many of our children are able to further their studies because of bursaries from our Municipalities. The continued support by our pastors in various denominations is highly appreciated and we are still looking forward to your intervention in the current academic year.

Last night, I accompanied our shining stars to the National Senior Certificate awards hosted by honourable Minister of Basic Education, Mme Angie Motshekga. It was heartwarming to see

our learners in the national stage representing the province in various categories. Some of them are here this morning as we continue to appreciate the hard work and sacrifices made.

I want to call upon the HoD Education, Khathutshelo Onicca Dederen and the DG of the Province, Nape Nchabeleng to ascend the stage to congratulate the candidates in the following category:
